


Dear Supporters,

Hello everyone and welcome again to today's London City Lionesses game. We are back in FR Women's Championship action against Lewes and I'd like to welcome everyone involved with the club and the fans of the Rooks who are visiting us today. It's good to have back-to-back games here at Prince's Park and hopefully we can capitalise on home advantage today.

Last weekend was clearly a disappointing score line to come away with - although, as is our mentality, we will always look to take the positives out of the game. I felt that despite losing by three goals, two of those came from set pieces, so we need to raise our levels in those key moments and avoid conceding иппесеззагу goals like that. What was more encouraging is that we had a significant share of possession in the game and moving forward the key lesson is that we need to convert that into goals. Lewes are coming off the back of two defeats, so we have to see that as an opportunity to pounce on a team who won't be in their best form – but we need to respect that they will be desperate to bounce back quickly.

James Marrs, Ali Monajati and all our staff have worked hard to prepare the team for today's game. Hopefully the players are up to today's challenge and it will be an exciting game for all to see.




