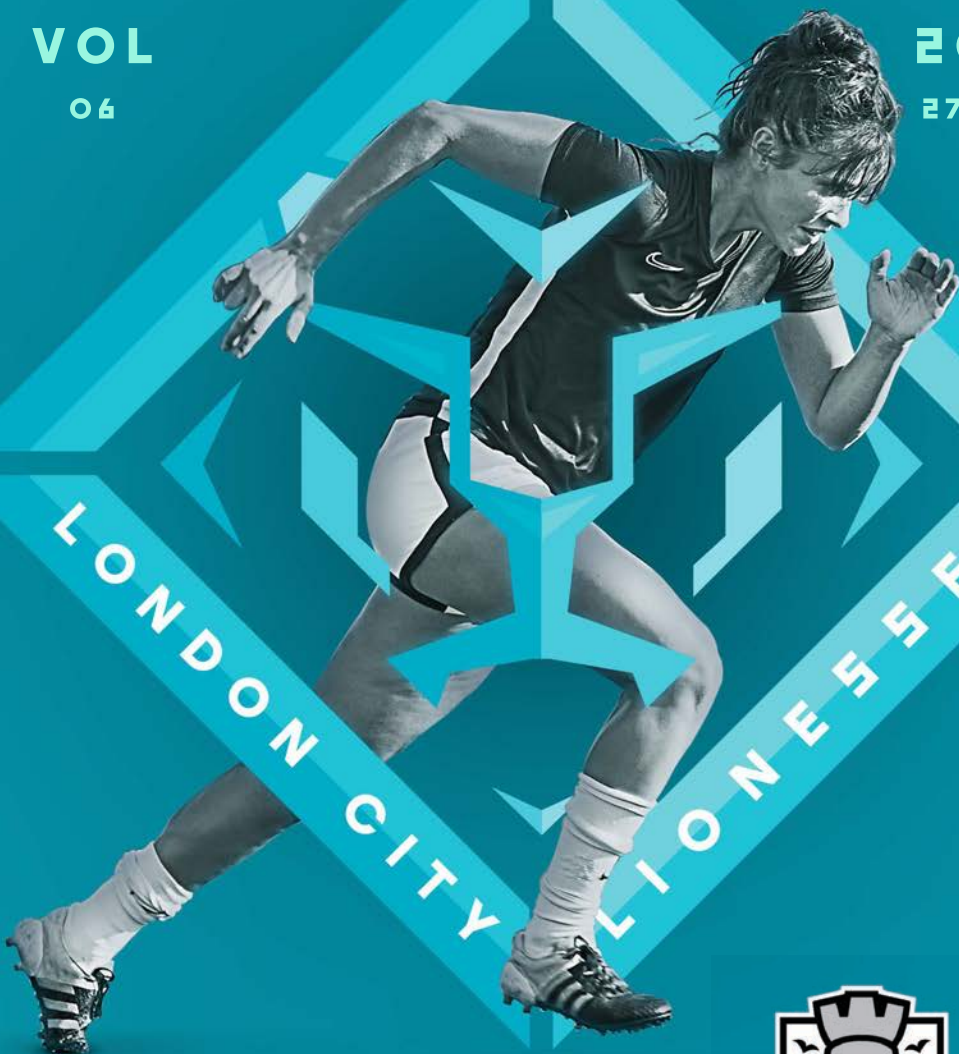

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GREETINGS FROM THE CHAIR

Dear Supporters,

Welcome back to Prince's Park once again, it's fantastic to be able to welcome you all back so soon after our Continental Cup game against London Bees last weekend. I'd like to welcome all from Lewes today, including players, staff and travelling supporters.

We're looking forward to getting back into league action today. Last weekend was a disappointing result, but we were happy with the level put in by the team and we were also pleased to rotate the squad slightly. I felt the game was quite balanced and we were unlucky with a couple of goals conceded from set pieces.

It's our second tough result in the Continental Cup and our next game after today is another group game against a WSL side in Bristol City. MESSAGE FROM JOHN BAYER

Hello everyone and welcome again to today's London City Lionesses game. We are back in FA Women's Championship action against Lewes and I'd like to welcome everyone involved with the club and the fans of the Rooks who are visiting us today. It's good to have back-to-back games here at Prince's Park and hopefully we can capitalise on home advantage today.

Last weekend was clearly a disappointing score line to come away with – although, as is our mentality, we will always look to take the positives out of the game. I felt that despite losing by three goals, two of those came from set pieces, so we need to raise our levels in those key moments and avoid conceding unnecessary goals like that. What was more encouraging is that we had a significant share of possession in the game and moving forward the key lesson is that we need to convert that into goals. We're good at keeping the ball but we need to be a bit more ruthless in the penalty area and we're encouraging the girls to be even more positive in this part of the pitch.

Aside from the result, it was great to welcome Liz Ejuji and Lucy Fitzgerald back into the starting XI and even better that they were both able to complete 90 minutes after injuries. We have a great group to choose from but we want to continue to give each player the best opportunity to perform so we can continue to strengthen our squad.

We fully expect Lewes to arrive here as a well organised and fully prepared side and from what we have seen of them, we know they will offer a physical threat along with a number of skilful players to watch out for. Zoe Ness, in particular, is a player we respect. The Scottish international is a dangerous attacking player who we will need to be wary of. Lewes are coming off the back of two defeats, so we have to see that as an opportunity to pounce on a team who won't be in their best form – but we need to respect that they will be desperate to bounce back quickly.

James Marrs, Ali Monajati and all our staff have worked hard to prepare the team for today's game. Hopefully the players are up to today's challenge and it will be an exciting game for all to see.

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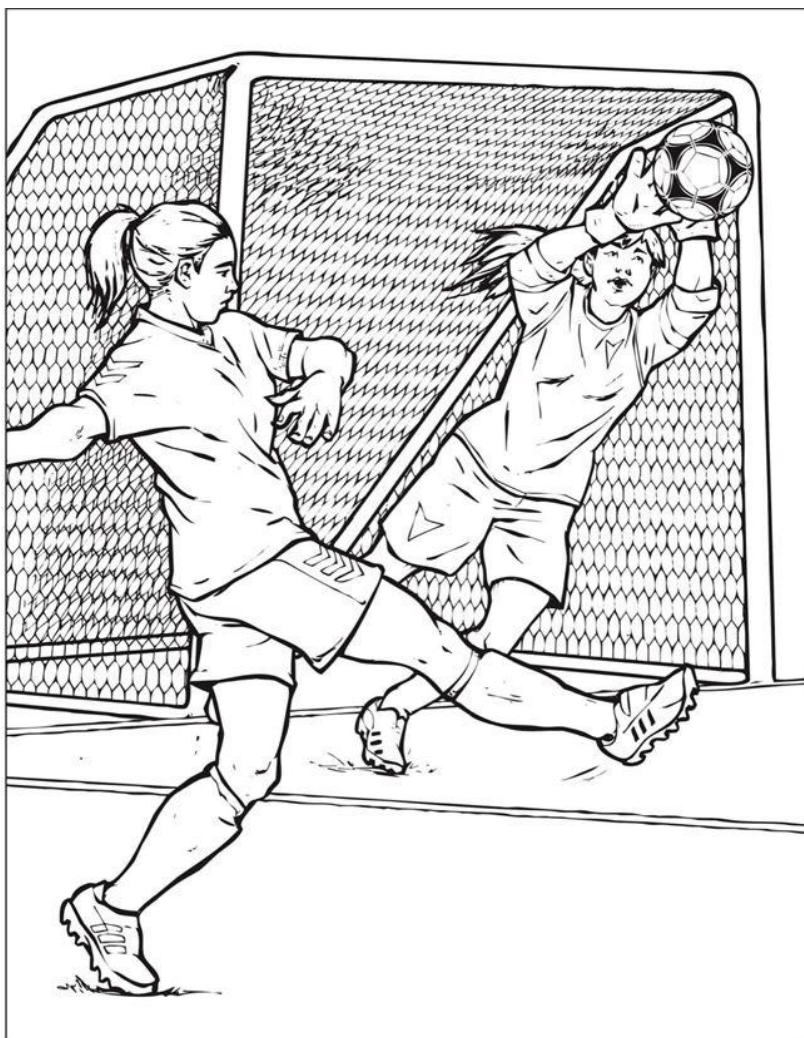
